What happened to winter? Did I miss it? Aside from the obligatory winter solstice swim, I had my first swim of the season on one of those unseasonably 'hot' days in late August. Normally I am more in line with tomato planting time for my first dip in the chilly sea, but this year we are all out of whack.so when to plant tomatoes then? Don't ask me, I am well and truly confused. We may still be tricked with a late frost or even snow...who knows? Peas planted as an experiment early in March are producing bumper crops, while those planted at the usual pea planting time just didn't germinate, presumably because it has not been cold enough down here in sunny Dodges Ferry.

Things did not slow down too much over the cooler months this year and the Grow and Learn Program saw grade 4 and 5 classes from Dodges Ferry Primary School working hard on investigating the adjacent wetland, culminating in a big revegetation program supported by the local Landcare group who provided advice on species and donations of plants. Hundreds of natives have been planted between the main road and the pond in an effort to increase habitat, slow the water flow and generally increase the health of this very important ecosystem. The school groups also experimented with no-dig gardening by creating mini raised beds in cylinders of chicken wire. These can been seen popping up all over the grassy area near the big



eucalypt and are now host to some very healthy broad bean plants, proving that you don't need to have lots of space or amazing soil to grow good food. This school term we will

be creating straw bale gardens with the grade four classes and making compost tea and other liquid fertilisers with grade fives, so if you want advice, recipe or instructions on these techniques come and visit us a few weeks into term 4 or ask those clever grade 4 and 5 kids how they did it.

Over winter we have been fortunate enough to hire out a few more private plots. These plots are designed to give people who don't have space or suitable growing ground the opportunity to grow their own veg while being part of the community garden buzz. We learn from them and they learn from us and each other. For a small annual fee, anyone can hire a plot, full to bursting with delicious organic soil, ready to plant food crops of their choosing. Plot hirers have access to our water (and tools when we are on site) and have the advantage of being able to potter alongside other keen gardeners, share tips, recipes, seeds, seedlings or swap produce. If you are interested in hiring a plot for yourself or your family, contact us here at the garden and we can find you a space. Note: Please don't pick produce from those plots labelled with a "Private Plot" sign, a lot of TLC has gone into them and the owners would be most upset to find all their basil has been picked on the day they planned to make pesto.

Unfortunately November also sees the culmination of the Food For all Tasmanians Funding. This two year grant allowed us to embark on various projects such as the building of the Pizza Oven, the establishment of the Food Co-op (many thanks to Jill), the creation of the Medicinal Herb Garden (muchas gracias Jess), the Grow and Learn program in conjunction with Dodges Ferry Primary School, weekend garden gatherings with music and Pizza. It has also made events such as the Seasonal Soirees and Harvest Feasts possible due to the extra time we have been able to spend here at the garden coordinating vol-

unteers and projects alike. With the end of this funding imminent we are sad to report that some of the above projects will be on hold until extra funding is secured. We are busy applying for grants (thank you Julia Curtis for countless hours grant writing for us) so that we can continue to provide the community with the events that have become so popular. In the spirit of gardens all over we will wait and see what the season brings; to nurture that which flourishes and accept that



which just needs turning over in the compost to make way for something new. In the meantime we will keep watering the carrots and feeding the worms.


