NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH IS BACK

Okines looking forward to welcoming our community back:

As the year 2020 progresses, staff and volunteers have been busy making preparations to welcome the broader community back into the Okines space. Things will be far from "normal" for some time and the current strict procedures around physical distancing and hand sanitising will remain in place. Community members can show their support by following the clearly marked guidelines as they enter and exit the space to ensure the good health and well being of all.

During the past three months Okines has continued to provide essential services to the community such as food assistance, No Interest Loans, a community garden, Food Co-op, internet access and photocopying services. From the 20th of July, Okines will introduce back some of the previous activities that were undertaken inside the main house. The separate building off the end of the house, the "Terrapin" as it is fondly known by Okines' staff, will be undergoing some improvements so the starting date for activities normally undertaken in this space will likely be towards the end of August.

A GUIDE TO ACTIVITIES AND SERVICES AT OKINES

From term 3 some activities will be commencing at Okines. We ask that you follow all guidelines as instructed by your group leader and you will find these indicated on the signage around the house.

- 1 Each room is limited to a max number of people and the 1.5 metre physical distancing requirement applies.
- 2 On entering the building each person must sanitise their hands and sign in with their contact details.
- 3 Each group is responsible for cleaning up after themselves, and sanitising all chairs, tables and surfaces that they have used. There will be cleaning solutions available for use.
- 4 If you are showing signs of flu like symptoms such as a fever, coughing, or shortness of breath it is imperative that you not enter the building or attend activities.

Prior to attending an activity we strongly recommend that you make contact with either the staff at Okines or the group leader of your activity to allow them to confirm numbers.

OKINES BOARD UPDATE

Okines Community House Inc is proud to be a member of the network of Neighbourhood Houses around Tasmania and one of around 1000 neighbourhood houses and community centres Australia wide. Run by the community, for the community, Neighbourhood Houses are places where people come together and find support, belonging and purpose. We work together to offer a wide range of programs and activities to support our local community and make a real difference in people's lives. Since March our Neighbourhood Houses in Tasmania have continued to provide essential services during the COVID-19 health emergency.

We play an important role in promoting community connection so that people can stay safe and stay in touch, with each house allocated an additional \$20,000 in state government funding to support that work. Okines Board members made the switch to meeting online using Zoom and we had weekly crisis management meetings to liaise with the Neighbourhood House network, assess our situation and adapt as restrictions changed. Our staff, our volunteers and community health and wellbeing have remained our top priorities. We worked through the uncertainty and in COVID-safe ways to maintain computer access, food relief, Food Co-op by pre-order and garden upkeep.

We also invested in updating the garden kitchen area, extending the Food Co-op building, insulating the Terrapin to create more comfortable and fit for purpose spaces for our community, and we're supporting the new Neighbourhood Watch group for the Southern Beaches area. Thank you to everyone who has done their bit to contribute - by staying home, by following the COVID-safe rules, by trying new ways of working, by making the difficult decision to cancel or postpone events, by staying in touch, and by putting community safety first in all we do. It's because of our collective efforts that we are now enjoying some COVID-safe face to face meetings and looking ahead to hosting much loved community events in 2021, including Okines 21st next March.

Take care, stay safe, stay connected.

Covid 19 provides opportunity for improvement in Okines Garden

Winter can be a time for quiet reflection. The cold pithy weather calls for a buffer of warmth, or a flurry of activity to create your own heat. People have always been good at changing or finding a niche in which to seek shelter, and many have become so comfortable its hard to feel the impact of external influences. The quiet time during covid, followed by winter has given us a time for pause and to reflect on what we take for granted and the default options we live. It seems that plants, like people, benefit from a period of introspection. Plants, on the other hand are always subject to the seasons with little control over extremes in weather. Their life cycles have adjusted accordingly and are exquisitely adjusted for optimal growth. It will be interesting to see how the spring plays out for people. Will we see some spectacular displays of colour? Or showy new strategies, a flurry of bursting blooms? Or perhaps just some tender new shoots after the winter dormancy which will slowly but steadily take hold.

Progress on updating the outdoor garden kitchen has been speeding along and the renovations are nearly complete. We've been enjoying collaborating and sharing resources with the coop who is also renovating their shop space.

Of course, we couldn't do it without the amazing volunteers who share their time and skills to make it happen. I'm blown away by the constant support, enthusiasm and brains they bring to the project.

– once again, it takes a community to support projects like these.

In other news, the garden is getting bees this spring! We will be assembling hives over the next few months and preparing an apiary site within the gardens. The bees will provide pollination services, honey and will be used for education & mentor-ship purposes. If you've always wanted to keep bees but haven't known where to start, or are simply interested in bees, please get in touch!

The garden is open, and we welcome people to visit and volunteer in line with current social distancing measures. On arrival, wash hands, please sign in and keep 1.5m apart from others. SOLSTICE 2020



Winter Solstice is a time of reflection, of where our planet is at, and what change we want for a new way of being in the next solar cycle. 
