












Celebrating Our Story Wayfinder Studio Interviews with Helene grounded in a practice rooted in slowness intimacy and responsibility

In recognition of the potential loss of collective knowledge and memories of how Okines was born and evolved over the last 25 years, we were keen to ensure the personal stories and shared history of Okines were captured, celebrated and can be used to inspire our efforts for the next 25 years. So, thanks to funding from an 2A4 grant, Helene Thomas from Wayfinder Mobile studio Story began conducting capturing interviews and stories, celebrating the journey of Okines Community House, in the lead up to our 25th Anniversary event, After the event, we asked Helene to share a little bit following on from the interviews...



"This place is amazing, the community house, Dodges Ferry, Carlton, Lewisham. I think when we're a community we can be very powerful." LLewyn King (age 9) "Firstly, being engaged to conduct story collecting in my own community was incredibly soul-satisfying and enriching. Having The Wayfinder Mobile Story Studio located in such a wonderfully vibrant location as Okines Community House was delightful. I really enjoyed the process of reaching out to potential interviewees and inviting them into my studio space. Right from the first session I recognised importance the collecting personal accounts of people's involvement, connection and relationship to Okines over the years. While I knew the purpose was to document the journey of Okines, from its humble beginnings to the present day (25 years later) and the important role it plays in the community, I also could see real benefit from capturing raw, tender, and often unspoken moments of people's lives as they interacted with Okines over the years. The result was some really beautiful, tender and moving stories. My process of collecting stories is



grounded in a practice rooted in slowness, intimacy, and responsibility and I really appreciated that Okines respected my process from the beginning of the project through to the end. To see the ripple effects of the completed stories is also one of the reasons I think the work of story collecting and story sharing is so important and valuable."

Hello to our Community Gardeners,

We have been fortunate to have some much needed rain of late & what a blessing that has been.

Myself, Janet & our team of wonderful volunteers have been busy these past few months, planting seed & seedlings in our garden beds. Gay has been putting her efforts into restoring some of our original garden beds & has done a mighty job. As with all our volunteers, she has been a great asset to our Garden.

We have recently planted our garlic bed, also planted spinach, peas, celery, cauliflower, beetroot, leek, broccoli, onions, shallots, carrots, along with various flowers to add some colour to the garden. We have had a bounty of tomatoes, zucchinis & pumpkins this season. Ready to harvest at the moment is silverbeet, turnips, lettuce, various herbs and mustard greens.

This garden is for our community to harvest from, so come along anytime and pick for your family. The Donation Box is under the sign in the centre if the Garden if you can afford it.

Don't forget Garden Tucker is on the 1st Monday of every month where you can work in the garden & join us for a delicious garden supplied meal & dessert. All are welcome. We have Steve playing some music for us to work by.

We recently held a Seed Raising Workshop where participants got to take home seed-filled egg cartons ready to pop in their gardens on germination. Our next workshop will be held September 15th for Spring Planting and we have had an extension to our Garden Kitchen thanks to funding from The Department of Premier & Cabinet, Community Support Fund Small Grants Program, so more shelter from the sun & rain for us all.

We would like to thank the many community members for their generous donations of seed, plants, a variety of manures, coffee grounds, egg shells & continued supply of kitchen scraps to our compost bay.

GROW AND LEARN PROGRAM DELIVERS HANDS ON EXPERIENCE FOR STUDENTS By Dawn Green

Thanks to the Grow & Learn program, students from Grade 3-5 experience the community garden as an outdoor classroom. The program is part of an ongoing partnership between the school and Okines Community House, and has been boosted with the help of a Community Action Grant from the Tasmanian Community Fund (TCF).

Linked with the national curriculum, the program covers topics that enhance the educational outcomes for children, appealing to a diverse range of learning styles. Here's what the project team said about last year's program:

"Led by our amazingly talented educators, Sonja and Nicola, in one of the activities, students discovered the special recipe to making great compost, and then got their hands dirty and created compost for Okines Community Garden. Grow & Learn has kicked off again in the new school year, and in addition to the immersive, experiential learning with the students, a reference group has been established which will meet each term.

The Grow & Learn reference group includes the deputy principal, students, community representatives representatives from Okines Community House and Southern Beaches Landcare Coastcare group. The goals of the reference group include creating a toolkit for schools to set up a Grow & Learn program within communities across Tasmania. "Feedback from the educators, students and teachers has overwhelmingly positive. Students are naturally curious about the world around them and they've been very engaged in the Grow & Learn program. There's something special about learning in an outdoor environment, outside of the classroom, which leaves a lasting impression on the students. always shoot up when the educators call-out for volunteers to grab a shovel or wheelbarrow during Grow & sessions in the Okines Community Garden."



SORELL INDIE KIDS GARDEN PROJECT



During the months of February & March this year we were fortunate to have a group of teenagers from the Indie School in Sorell visit us here at Okines Community Garden. They were enthusiastic with the projects they undertook,

OKINES COMMUNITY BIKE SHED

Okines Bike Shed continues to power on, nearly 5 years after it started. Donated bikes continue arriving, bikes picked up off hard waste piles, bikes being sold, bikes being given away and volunteers constantly repairing and reconditioning bikes. We've given away hundreds of bikes and repaired hundreds mostly for free or a small donation.

It has been a great asset to our community supplying cheap or free bikes, at the same time recycling hundreds of bikes that otherwise would have ended up in landfill. Bikes not repairable are stripped of their usable parts, which are then reused or given away to those who repair their own bikes.

Besides repairing bikes we also fix tyres, punctures etc on prams, wheelbarrows, scooters, and any other small wheel machines.

We continue to run a school program teaching students how to fix bikes while at the same time learning how to use tools and equipment for the various required tasks. We also have some home schoolers volunteering as part of their education to learn practical skills & work experience.

John, Dave, George, Loki, Paul, Rodney, Llewyn & Glenn are current volunteers but we welcome anyone else interested. Some volunteers do everything but others have special interests where they mainly fix a certain style of bike.

Young or old, into biking or not, all are welcome to help. There's not just repairing to be done, there's also sorting spare parts, wheels & tyres, admin, building maintenance, PR and cuppas to be made.

During the school holidays, many kids spend time at our bike shed fixing their own bikes, reconditioning one for themselves, helping with repairs or just hanging around for company. They are all welcome but with parental supervision.

If you have an interest in getting involved, need a bike for free or a small price for a fancy one, need your bike repaired for free or a small donation, need free spare parts for your bike, or just want to say hello and see what we do, please call in any time Mondays and Thursdays 11am to 3 pm. If you can't make those days please make contact and we could organise to meet you there another time.

Every time we use our bikes instead of the car we are helping the planet and our health.
