UPDATES FROM OKINES

Happy Spring! The garden is flourishing, the winds are blowing and we have lots of exciting things happening at Okines.

We have had a busy few months and are delighted to share our reviewed, updated, and finalised Mission, Vision & Values for our Strategic Plan 2025-2030! This process started back in May with a Strategic Planning Session, continued on with a small working group who pulled together the first version which we tested with our community in August. We had a fantastic response during that week with lots of good input and feedback which we have incorporated into the final version, which we are excited to share. A huge thank you to everyone who has been involved, and we look forward to working together on the priorities identified over the next few years.

We have also had quite a few successful grant applications come through, which will enable some great new projects and infrastructure improvements here at Okines!

- Stronger Communities Grant from the Australian Government for improving garden accessibility. This work has already started, with paths widened and resurfaced, a new ramp installed, and safety markings added.
- Quick Wins Grant through the Tasmanian Government Regional Drought Resilience Planning Program to create a garden gathering and event area (come check out our new stage at the December 5th Soiree), improve water storage and irrigation and increase skills in water wise gardening.
- Strengthening Rural Communities Grant through the FRRR to strengthen our community's climate resilience. The project will allow us to work with the palawa community, local organisations and interested community members to better understand our risks, create a shared vision, and take action to improve our resilience.
- Mental Health Week Grant to run a series of wellbeing workshops and activities led by local facilitators.
- \$90,000 grant from the Tasmanian Government to upgrade our Community Kitchen facilities, expand the Food Co-op, and more as part of a food relief to food resilience project.

We also had some great free events recently including a booked out Pinot & Perimenopause talk with Dr. Hannah Chapman, the Grow & Learn Forum, Repair Café, Clothes Swap and the always wonderful monthly Dodges Ferry Flicks and Co-op Coffee Shop Open Mic sessions. There is always so much happening here, so we hope to see you soon! We are always in need of more volunteers, so if you'd like to get involved, we'd love to hear from you! With gratitude, Lissa



Community Pantry Primrose Sands

We have recently finished the 10-week trial of offering a Community Pantry Pop-up at Primrose Sands to enable more people to access our food assistance program. The trial was funded by the Tasmanian Government's Community Food Relief grant and proved a huge success!



The trial saw approximately 250 visits from community members accessing food assistance overall. Numbers steadily increased each week over the 10 weeks as word spread. A range of free food was offered weekly including fresh fruit and vegetables, bread and bakery products, pre-prepared meals, and pantry items.

Survey results reflected the great success of the trial, with 100% of respondents saying they found the program very helpful – particularly in terms of access to food and cost savings. Other feedback showed that people had a greater quantity and variety of food and a reduction in financial stress because of the pop-up.

People also reported increased social connection and shared how much they valued the chance to see and talk with other people at pop up. Several people reported feeling isolated in the community because of a lack of private and public transport, living alone, health issues, or having caring responsibilities. Many of these factors are an ongoing barrier to accessing our Dodges Ferry Community Pantry Food Assistance Program, and 100% of people surveyed said they would continue to use the Primrose Sands pop-up if it continued.



So what now?

We would like to thank and acknowledge our amazing volunteers who did such a great job welcoming community members, transporting supplies and managing the pop up over the period of the trial, as well as the Primrose Sands Hall Committee for offering in-kind use of the Primrose Sands Community Hall.

It was great to have funding to start this initiative but now we need support from the community to keep it going! Two local families have generously offered to help support our food assistance program through weekly financial contributions totalling \$120, but we will need additional support to have enough food supplies to meet the demand and keep the pantry operating at Primrose.



How you can help!

If we had 10 people contribute \$5-\$10 a week it would make all the difference. We would also welcome donations of shelf-stable pantry items, toiletries, or excess produce from keen gardeners.

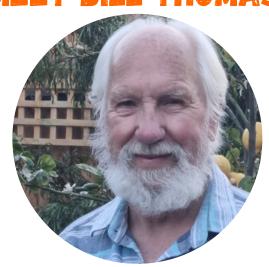
VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHTS

Personally, I feel I have grown in confidence meeting people from so many different walks of life and being asked to take responsibility in areas I would previously never have considered.

Meeting so many different and interesting people. Everything about Okines is such a positive experience and I love the whole Neighbourhood House organisation and all it stands for. I love how our House welcomes anyone from anywhere and will go out of its way to help wherever it can.



From the Community Garden Team

Hello to all fellow gardeners, and welcome to spring - the season every gardener looks forward to when we see an explosion of growth.

Here in our garden, we have been busy fertilising all of our fruit-producing trees and have been rewarded with many flowers on our plum, apple, cherry and pear trees. Hopefully the winds won't affect the production of fruit too much.

We have been planting many summer vegies, including pumpkin, zucchini, squash, cucumbers, and tomatoes. Ready for harvest at the moment are peas, silver beet, asparagus, spinach, radish, broccoli, mustard greens and a variety of herbs. Our donation box resides in the centre of the garden to assist us in continuing to provide food for our community. We are also seed saving and packaging seeds for sale. Our chooks are laying well at the moment, and we are selling excess eggs for \$6 dozen. We are also selling bottles of nutritious worm juice to feed your veggies.

We would like to thank all our dedicated volunteers who assist us in the never-ending work that it takes in a garden to produce healthy organic food. Thanks to our community who continue to provide kitchen scraps to our compost heaps. Thanks also to Ray for the pigeon manure and Jo from Carlton for horse manure, as well as Dodges Bakery for coffee grounds and eggshells. Thanks also to Torenius Timber for donations of sawdust and tomato stakes.

We have had several successful grants that have allowed us to resurface our main garden path and purchase an extra rainwater tank.

Sadly, it will not be possible to continue DIGnity at the moment, due to a lack of funding, however we know that many locals enjoy meeting and catching up with friends, so the DIGnity team hope to offer informal cuppa and catch ups in the garden - so watch this space!

Our recent Spring Planting Workshop was attended by many locals who enthusiastically joined in with seed sowing for the upcoming summer crops. Thank you to all who attended. Our next workshop will be Compost Making, to be held on Monday, 8th December.

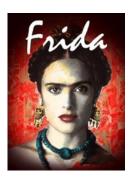

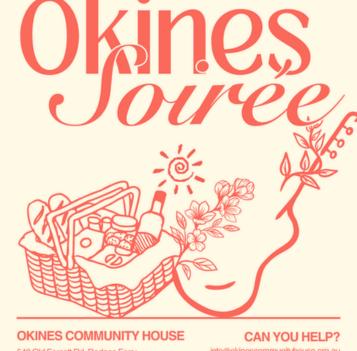

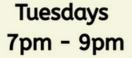


Social Singing Group
