It has been a busy start to the year at Okines. We had a fabulous couple of Soirees in February and March, taking advantage of the warmer weather with joyous gatherings of about 100 people, enjoying live music, good conversations, dancing, delicious food and drinks. The garden is looking incredible and pumped out some great harvests of apples, pears, tomatoes and more. The food co-op now has scrumptious sourdough bread and eggs available by weekly order. Our bike repair shed has been offering free childrens bikes and supporting people across our community to learn new skills and get active through cycling and the film society has continued our popular monthly film screenings.

If you have not been in recently, you will find an upgraded kitchen when you next visit, thanks to funding through the Tasmanian Government Capital Works for Food Relief grant. The new dishwasher has won our hearts with its super quick and efficient cycles. This grant will also help us to improve storage facilities for the food co-op/community pantry, which we hope will get underway very soon.

The other big project we have been working on over the past few months is the climate resilience project funded by FRRR and we have an article further on with more info on that.

We've had some big changes in the house with our two wonderful Community Connection & Admin Officers finishing up. Southern Beaches 2040 RESILIENCE WORKSHOPS



Project update & next steps

Last year Okines Community House secured funding from the Foundation for Regional and Rural Renewal to strengthen our ability to face disasters and the possible impacts of climate change. We started in November last year with the Stories of the Southern Beaches event. An evening of storytelling, celebrating and acknowledging our strengths and everything that this community has already achieved and overcome and what we can learn from it.

We continued this work by running 2 workshops focused on Southern Beaches 2040, starting with a 'Dream the Vision' workshop on April 11th exploring what we want our community to look like by 2040, taking into consideration likely climate impacts and how we can strengthen resilience to help us survive and thrive through any challenges that come our way.

So many brilliant ideas were shared and then prioritised into key themes. The second 'Plan the Future' workshop held on May 2nd, then took the prioritised themes and asked people to sort based on the areas they were most interested in. This led to 4 groups forming, which worked through a series of strategic and then practical questions to flesh out project ideas that we can work on together as a community to implement.



The 4 project ideas and groups that formed were focused on

- **Food Security** - identify public spaces to grow edible plants and systems to promote sharing produce, skills and knowledge across the community
- **Knowledge Hub** - Create an accessible central directory consisting of 3 parts; local services, businesses and people offering and seeking skills and knowledge exchange.
- **Renewable Energy Hub** - Establish a carbon neutral (or positive) community facility to model what is possible and provide a shared resource for community to tap into (ie EV chargers)
- **Connectivity of Community Spaces** - Build upon existing assets to establish a network of multi-use accessible paths and amenities to connect our community.

Between the birds & children we have managed to harvest a variety of apples, pears, plums, peaches, apricots & many berries.

We are currently been planting veggies for the winter months with cabbage, cauliflower, broccoli, spring onions & celery. Greens such as kale, silverbeet, spinach & lettuce are also available.

Our labyrinth revamp is completed, taking many hours and much effort by Gaye and various volunteers. We are overjoyed their hard work has paid off. For anyone wanting to wander around the Labyrinth, it is situated behind the Food Co-op at the rear of the Garden.

We held a Seed Bomb Workshop recently that was enthusiastically attended by many from our local communities. No doubt during the recent rain, many of the flower filled seed bombs were successfully launched.

Return to the Labyrinth

A MINDFUL SPACE IN OKINES COMMUNITY GARDEN

The Labyrinth is a walk of quiet contemplation & peace located in the Okines Community Garden, behind the Food Co-op Building. It was created back in 2015, through a creative arts project called 'Walking Each Other Home', a collaborative research project run by the Okines Community Garden & Centre for Rural Health that aimed to better understand, support & weave end of life, grief & bereavement support into the Okines Community Garden. To this day, the Labyrinth remains an important place for many in our community to remember loved ones no longer with us.

The path meanders & changes directions a bit like a maze. When you arrive at the centre, you then walk back the way you came in. It's a good way to slow down, reflect & release unneeded thoughts.

Over the past few months, Gaye Webb, one of our amazing volunteers (pictured above) began working hard to revamp the Labyrinth and on Mon 23rd of March, some young international travellers (pictured bottom left) volunteered their time to help out as well, refreshing the space by getting the wood chips & borders finished. The extra hands on wheelbarrows and spreading woodchips was invaluable. Thanks to this extra help the Labyrinth is looking fabulous & is now finished and ready to welcome visitors again!

GUIDE TO WALKING THE LABYRINTH

There's really no right way or wrong way to walk a labyrinth, but generally speaking there are three phases:

1. Releasing on the way in, letting go of what no longer serves.
2. Receiving a sense of peace and calm as you pause in the centre.
3. Resolving to engage with the world in a new way as you follow the same path back out.

New & Exciting Partnership Programs



We are very excited about partnering with the Hobart Clothing Hub to offer a new pop-up service to our community. Hobart Clothing Hub partners with Thread Together and other organisations to rescue new clothing from landfill and provide it free to financially vulnerable people in Tasmania. They supply mostly adult sized clothing through their hub, mobile van and site wardrobes.

Our partnership will see they Hobart Clothing Hub visiting Okines quarterly alongside of our Community Pantry. Community members will be able to select up to 5 items of new clothing completely free of charge. The Clothing Hub will also offer 1-on-1 appointments for people to refresh their wardrobes. These sessions are ideal for those in the job market or starting a new role which requires a wardrobe to match. Meet the Grow & Learn Reference Group

An Okines Community House initiative launched in 2013, for many years the Grow & Learn Program led groups of students from Dodges Ferry Primary School through a range of hands-on learning experiences at Okines Community Garden, Lagoon Park and the Okines Beach foreshore.

Thanks to a grant from the Tasmanian Community Fund, secured by Dodges Ferry Primary School Association volunteers, in 2024 the Grow & Learn program was extended until December 2025.

During that time, the Grow & Learn reference group formed to explore options for the future of the program and to create a strategy to share with other communities and schools across Tasmania.

Who are they....



..as well as mapping out opportunities within existing programs and outdoor spaces.

The group consists of program coordinator Dawn, Okines manager Lissa, Dodges Ferry Primary School vice-principal Angela, Sorell councillor Melinda, Southern Beaches Landcare Coastcare rep Helen, and local education advisor, Jenny. Melinda, Dawn and Angela have also been long-serving Dodges Ferry Primary School Association committee members and Melinda was president of the Okines Board when Grow & Learn first took shape.

Together, the group has looked at the strengths of the Grow & Learn program and ways in which it might continue.

This included running the Grow & Learn Forum last year, which included an Okines Garden Tour with DFPS students, Okines garden coordinator Janet, and Grow & Learn educator, Nicola. Grow & Learn founders Gabe and Claire spoke about their experiences creating the program, and former principal of Moonah Primary School, Ange Mezeitis, spoke about the school's partnership with the 24 Carrot Program. Lastly, participants explored the question...

Where to from here?

Student feedback showed how much they loved the Grow & Learn experience and now the reference group is busy in the evaluation phase of the grant.

"It's becoming clear to us that the Grow & Learn program is evolving into more of a framework, a set of principals and resources," said Dawn. "This makes it an integrated approach rather than a set program, which is more sustainable and strengths-based, using existing resources to make it more resilient and effective."

Aligning with the school community's outdoor learning strategy, this includes working with teachers at Dodges Ferry Primary School to encourage them to bring their students to Okines Garden..

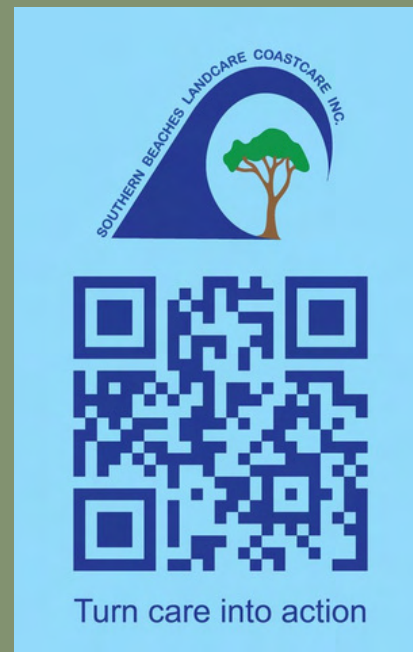

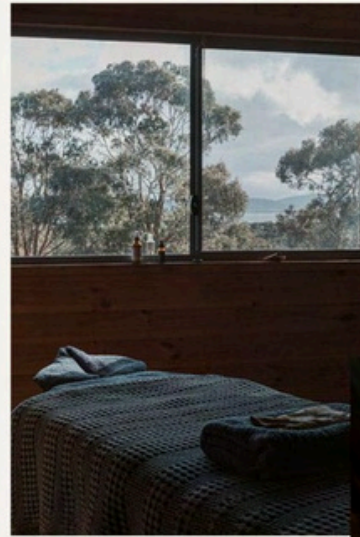

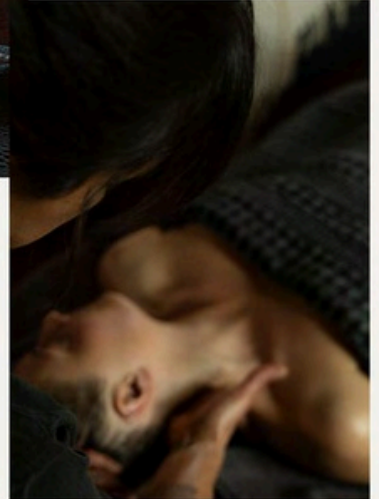
